The gift will benefit both the Swem Library and the library at Mason School of Business.

Upon completion of Alan B. Miller Hall, the Elizabeth "Bee" McLeod Business Library will be located off the main public space on the building's second floor, a prime location that will elevate the services that the school provides its students. The library will provide patrons with access to electronic and print business research resources, as well as research assistance by a professional business librarian.
