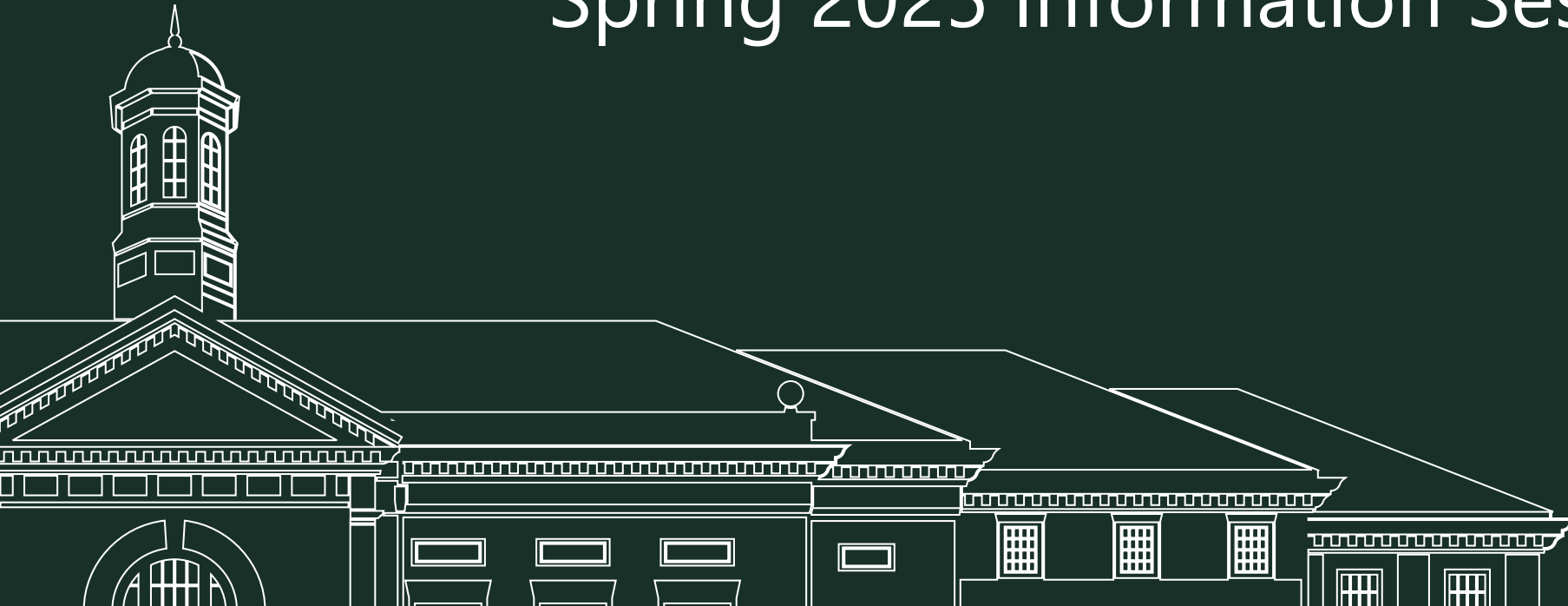

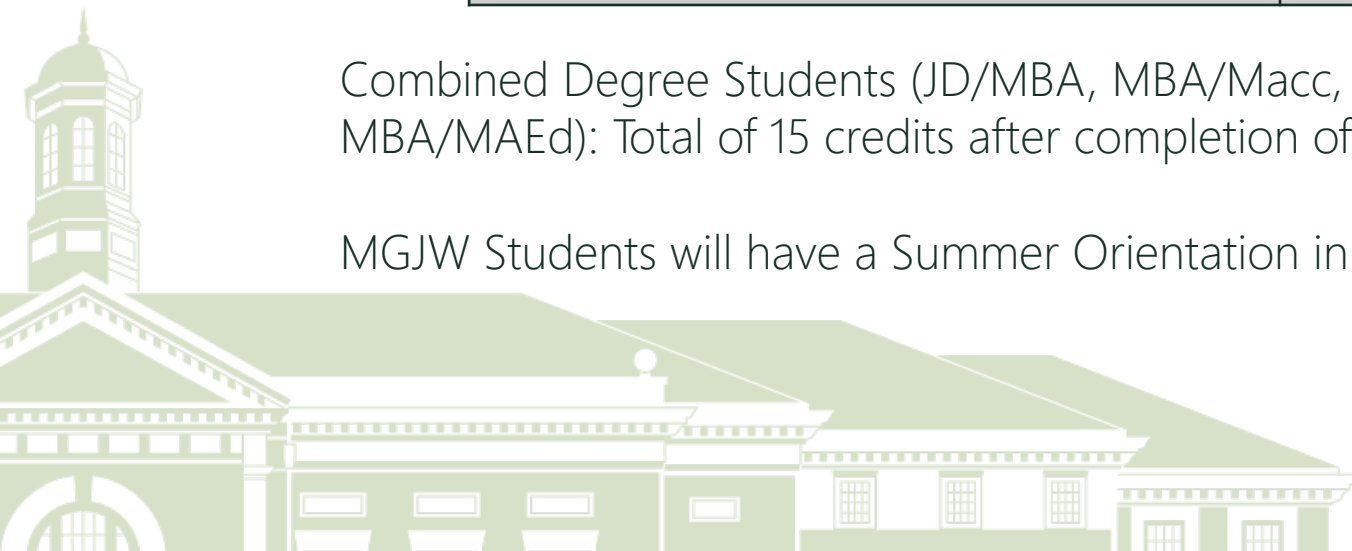

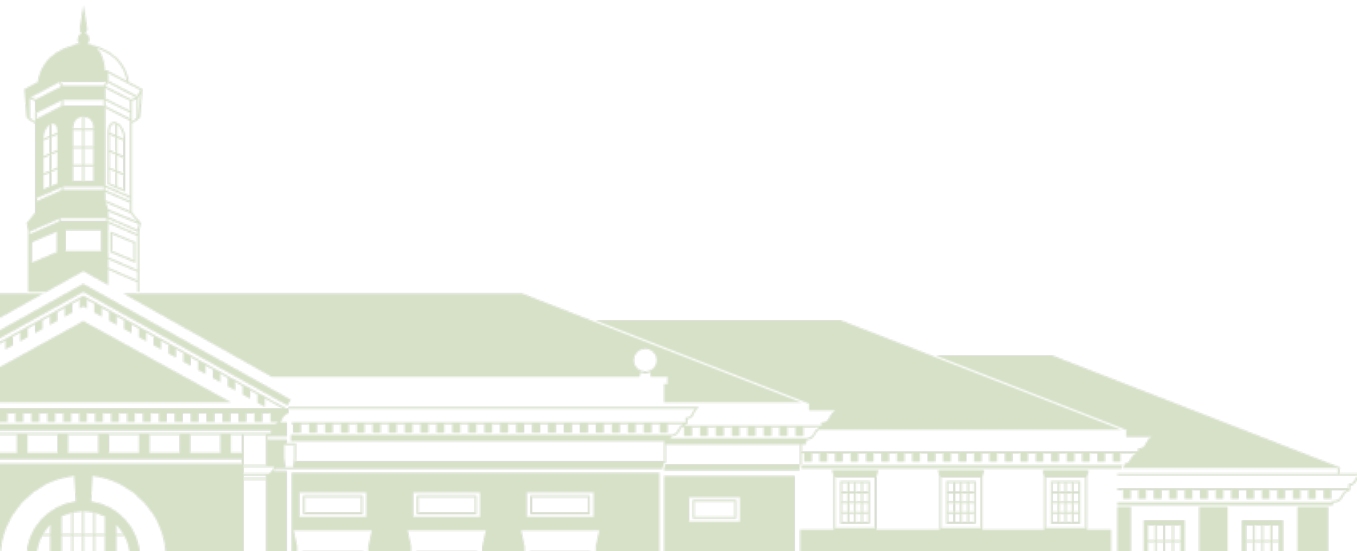

Marketing Research (Does not count toward specialization requirement total credits, but is required for the specialization.)	Marketing
Financial Statement Analysis, Modeling & Valuation	Optional class for electives
Driving Organizational Performance	Optional class for electives

Specialization Requirements

- Many specializations require first and second year courses.
- Some require CAMs
- All require second year courses
- Minimum requirement is 11 hours

Elective Selection Survey

- You will receive a survey on **Monday, 11/11** that is due on Sunday, **November 24 at 11:59 pm** EST to make your selections.
- In the survey, you will indicate your specialization preference AND rank the 1st year elective options.
- Each student must submit the elective preference survey by the deadline or you may not be able to receive your preferred electives.
- You will be informed of your elective courses by **Friday, December 6**.
- You will be registered by the Graduate Registrar for all your Spring 2025 classes.
